



The Idaho Office of Broadband's (IOB) prequalification phase of the Broadband, Equity, Access, and Deployment (BEAD) Program subgrantee selection has concluded. Forty-five applications were submitted through two phases of the prequalification application process. The IOB and the State's third-party consultants completed a comprehensive review of all submissions in accordance with current National Telecommunications and Information Administration (NTIA) requirements.

The Idaho Broadband Advisory Board and IOB are delighted to announce that 43 prequalification applications have been approved, qualifying them to move to the next phase of the BEAD subgrantee selection process. These 43 applicants will be invited to submit project applications for BEAD funding.

The approved prequalification applications demonstrated financial, managerial, operational, and technical capabilities in addition to compliance with required standards and laws, as required by the [BEAD Notice of Funding Opportunity \(NOFO\)](#). Passing the prequalification phase allows applicants to proceed with the BEAD application process, submitting applications for proposed projects to the IOB and the State of Idaho.

Important to note, qualifying to apply for BEAD funding does not guarantee, in any way, a preliminary selection through this program. The State of Idaho will conduct a fair, open, competitive, and transparent BEAD funding application process in accordance with NTIA guidelines and as outlined in Idaho's approved [Initial Proposal Volume II](#). Additionally, the State of Idaho reserves the right to request or require any additional information or documentation it deems necessary.

The next step will be releasing the funding application guidelines and opening the Funding Application Phase. The funding application will be open for 45 days. After the funding application window closes, the IOB and the State's third-party consultants will review, [score](#),

and rank applications and conduct application deconfliction and discussions with applicants as needed. The review and scoring phase will be approximately a 90-120-day process immediately following the closing of the Funding Application Phase.

Idaho will provisionally select subgrantee awards in accordance with state and federal BEAD Program rules, including the BEAD NOFO, NTIA guidance documents, and Idaho's Initial Proposal Volume II, to evaluate and select provisional awardees.
